- 2 Diseases not foreign to Australia. Mandatory notification of presence or suspicion of disease. Mandatory quarantine on presence of disease. Discretionary quarantine on suspicion of disease.
- 3 For areas outside the Cattle Tick Infected Area (Kimberley). Mandatory notification of presence or suspicion of disease. Mandatory quarantine on presence of disease. Discretionary quarantine on suspicion of disease.
- 4 Diseases not foreign to Australia. Mandatory notification of presence of disease. Discretionary quarantine on presence of disease.
